Theology: “the Science of Things Divine” or “Words

How would you answer this question? These are two varying definitions which I found online, first from Augustine of Hippo and the latter from a Yahoo forum. Some of you might say they are identical—or at least that one stems from the other. I find these explanations individually describe first what I am currently experiencing in my studies and, secondly, what is going on within the campus ministry.

As you know, I have been studying at the teacher's college, with the predominate goal of coming into contact with other students and being a support to the Christians who are studying there. In the past two years God has amazed me with countless opportunities to share about what I believe, to offer prayer, to answer questions about faith, and also to come alongside students as they wrestle with questions of faith. One major arena for this “struggling” has been my theology lectures. I so much looked forward to studying theology, seeing it as a chance to compliment the practical training and ministry of Campus Crusade with theological knowledge. In addition, I found it exciting to see how religion is taught in schools because I too used to teach elementary school.

Don't get me wrong. I thoroughly enjoy the unique possibility of further education and am continually learning new things. **The problem lies in that sometimes what I am learning is totally different from what I personally believe.** In my opinion, what is taught in Theology, with content predominantly scientific and intellectual, fits more to the “science of things divine” definition above. There are times when what is taught in the classroom is incredibly hard for me, as a Christian, to hear. I feel as if the Bible is sometimes restricted to what can be scientifically proven, the miracles of Jesus within its pages questioned, and the essential truth that, in the end, it's all about one thing—love—is in danger of being forgotten in the abyss of discussion and the historic-critical method.

My hope is that I, and the rest of the students studying Theology, would learn to discern the truth from the theories/untruth. (If any of you pastors have tips on how we can do this, please let me know.) After all, His truth will set us free (John 8:32) - free to relish in a life with Him. I, again am grateful for this chance to study and hope that, as a result, I will be able to pass on the love of God to my fellow students.

On a much more positive note, I am so encouraged by the amount of “words from God” that is sprinkled throughout our ministry this semester—at our weekly worship services, during prayer meetings, in mentoring or small groups, but also in reaching out to others. In the last few weeks, we have been able to share our faith with and/or pray for others while swimming, in the cafeteria, in “chalking” the city, or while feeding the homeless. The group's longing to know and experience Jesus more in every part of our life is dynamic and contagious.

In the last two weeks before the semester break I hope that God will use me to help fuse these two areas together—that the excitement and joy found within the ministry will spill over into and onto my theology lectures. I hope that as students feverishly study for the upcoming exam, their eyes will be open to see the God who takes great delight in them, rejoicing over them with singing (Zeph 3:17).

I am coming to the States to visit! That's right! Get your calendars out. I will be in the states from August 1-September 17, and would love to reconnect with as many of you as possible. You have all been such a support to me. I would so much like to personally say thank you, hear what has been going on in your lives, and answer any questions you might have about the ministry in Freiburg., If you are around during this time and would be open for a visit, please let me know. christinajhorning@googlemail.com.

Council Actions July 2011

- Council approved a \$1500.00 Agape Fund donation to the Gahanna Summer Lunch Club. The program targets families who are eligible for free or reduced-priced lunches within the Gahanna-Jefferson schools, but it is open to anyone.
- Approved a fund raising request for two annual events in November- "Make it, Bake it" and "Empty Bowls".
- Approved updates to Aaron McCullough's job description to reflect his additional areas of supervisory responsibilities.
- Discussed progress of the call committee for the position of Children's and Family Ministry Director. The call committee has been conducting interviews and hopes to have a candidate soon.
- Approved the addition of 11 members to St. Luke and the transfer of 4 members to another ELCA congregation per their request.
- Approved the request of resignation from Council member Matt Erick dated June 5, 2011. Council will seek a replacement to finish his term, which expires July 2012.

Council President's Letter

Dear St. Luke Family,

In the July Council meeting we voted to send \$1,500 from the Agape Benevolence fund to the Gahanna Summer Lunch Club. This program began four years ago through a partnership of local churches called "The Bridge of Gahanna." The program targets families who are eligible for free or reduced-priced lunches within the Gahanna-Jefferson schools, but it is open to anyone. Five days a week, volunteers provide takeout sack lunches at Goshen Lane Elementary School or serve hot meals to students at Royal Manor and Lincoln elementaries. The meals are sponsored by Gahanna-area churches, restaurants, and businesses.

It may not always be obvious to us, but the need in our community is great. I spoke with Karen Brantley, the lunch club director, who shared with me that they had already served 5,000 meals by July 8 with six weeks remaining this summer. By comparison, the program served 4,500 meals the entire summer in 2010. Our donation will be used to purchase food and paper products as Gahanna Summer Lunch Club strives to serve an all-time high number of meals in 2011.

There is also a need for volunteers to serve meals, especially in August. I encourage you to pray for this ministry - that the children of our community will be nourished and experience the love of God through those who are serving them.
