A Trial Rigged In Our Favor

Outside of far too many traffic violations, there has been only one time I got in trouble with the law. Around 2 a.m. on a summer night after my 8th grade year, a couple buddies and I thought it was a bright idea to sneak out of my backyard where we were sleeping out. We tried to wake up another friend to join us by knocking on her window. Her father thought we were criminals trying to break into the house and came out to defend his family and home. He caught me, tackled me to the ground and started to strangle me. I passed out due to lack of air. He eventually pinned me down in his front yard and had his wife call the police. Waiting for the police to arrive, I was filled with fear as to what would happen to me. When the officer arrived, I looked up to see the only member of the Norwalk police force that I knew, Patrolman Short. He was the police officer who often came to our schools to teach us good things and be our friend. When I saw him, I knew I would be fine. Patrolman Short took me home and the matter ended there as far as law enforcement was concerned.

Facing judgment at any level can be frightening. When the stakes are an eternity enjoyed in heaven or suffered in hell, our final judgment could scare us dead cold. Except ... except ... except ... behold the one given the authority to render our final judgment – *“the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead.”* (Acts 10:42) *“God has set a day when He will judge the world with justice by the man He has appointed.”* (Acts 17:31) Jesus taught, *“The Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son.”* (John 5:22) *“For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ.”* (Romans 5:10) *“Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead.”* (2 Timothy 4:1) Based on these New Testament teachings, we confess in the Apostles’ Creed that Jesus Christ will come to judge the living and the dead.

Talk about a trial rigged in our favor! Jesus will judge us. Jesus stated His whole purpose saying, *“I have come that you may have life.”* (John 10:10) Jesus sacrificed His life to make certain that we would have eternal life in heaven. He is so completely biased in our favor, any judgment before Him is eternally fixed in our favor. Indeed, Jesus has already rendered a judgment from the cross, *“Father, forgive them.”* Because of Jesus, we already know our verdict, *“Not guilty! Eternal life in heaven.”*

This rigged judgment in our favor was the Father’s intent all along. Seven hundred years before Jesus was born, God spoke through the prophet Isaiah, *“The Lord is our judge, the Lord is our ruler, the Lord is our King: He will save us.”* (Isaiah 33:22) The cadence of that verse is to be enjoyed. Say it out loud with rising inflection and then drop your voice and deliver the killer ending, *“He will save us!”* Our Father in heaven so loves us that there was never a doubt as to the final judgment He would bring about through Jesus. The evil one was deluded to think that he had tempted us into an eternity in hell. Our Father gave Jesus to die and rise again to defeat the power of evil and death, and then ... get this ... put Jesus in charge of the rendering our final judgment. No mob boss, with all the authorities in his pocket, has had it as good as we will have it at our final judgment.

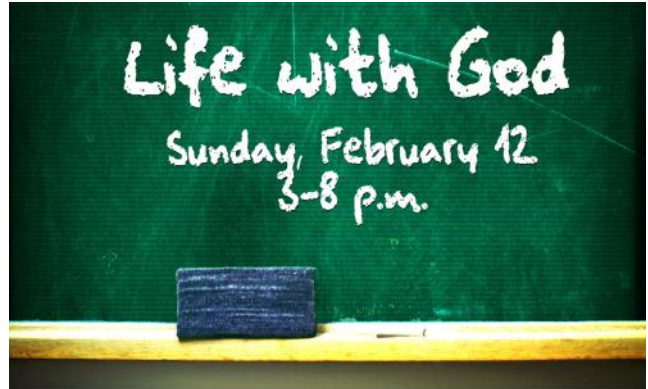
Have blessed assurance dear ones, it is a fixed deal. For all those who believe in Jesus, the final judgment is rigged in our favor. *“Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day – and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for His appearing.”* (2 Timothy 4:8) I was not longing for the appearing of a police officer when I pinned down in the yard. Had I known it would be Patrolman Short, I would have. Knowing that Jesus is the One who will come to judge, we can all long for the day of His appearance. It will be all good for us! *Have no fear, little flock, for the Father has chosen to give you the Kingdom; have no fear little flock.”* Hymn # 476 Lutheran Book of Worship

Lutheran World Relief
Haiti Update

It's painful to recall the horrible earthquake that hit Port-au-Prince in January 2010. The poorest country in this hemisphere, Haiti was the country least able to handle such a shocking event. Even before the earthquake, the majority of Haitians faced decades of problems, most of which begin and end in extreme poverty. Poor health and malnutrition, an utter lack of work opportunities, government corruption and the devastation of Haiti's natural resources have left few options.

Through partner organizations, LWR has been working in Haiti since 1997 to attack the vicious cycle of poverty there: With limited resources for earning income, cooking food or farming, Haitians have cut down huge sections of the country's forests, making charcoal and clearing farmland. This clear-cutting disrupts rain cycles, so that the region oscillates between droughts and torrential rains. The resulting landslides and flooding destroy people's livelihoods and infrastructure. As in so many places where there is little clean water to drink, people spend most of their lives sick or weakened from past illness; babies often die of dehydration from diarrhea. In addition, years of corruption and dictatorships, which arise more easily when a large part of a country is poor and uneducated, stunt opportunity for people who lack power or influence.

With your support, LWR works to end this kind of human suffering in Haiti. In the wake of the earthquake, we delivered immediate relief:

- Distributing water, food and resources like tarps, Quilts, Personal Care Kits and School Kits.
- Supporting cash-for-work programs, latrine-building for sanitation, and basic medical monitoring and treatment training in communities of displaced people.

We are now committed to seeing Haiti through long-term rehabilitation.

- Relieving hunger and malnutrition through agriculture programs that include setting up seed banks and providing technical training for farmers.
- Supporting farmer associations that will give farmers better bargaining power for buying seeds and equipment and selling crops.
- Building and distributing water filters to give people access to clean drinking water, and training locals how to maintain them.
- Getting artisans back to work and increasing their incomes through business training and helping them access credit.
- Helping establish community-based organizations that will give the poor collective power to influence their government.

Nancy's Place A Refuge for Homeless Women

Nancy's Place, located at 325 E. Long Street, Columbus, was established by *Lutheran Social Services* to shelter the growing number of homeless women in central Ohio. It is affiliated with *Faith Mission* which has served the homeless community by offering a secure, Christian based environment for homeless men and women on an emergency walk-in basis. In addition to providing shelter, food and clothing, *Nancy's Place* also helps them access longer term solutions such as housing, employment assistance, medical, dental, vision care, counseling, and support groups. The women's shelter serves up to 42 women each night; and when winter comes, it may increase up to 52 women each night.

Lutheran women in the central Ohio area have been helping these women by donating toiletries that they collect on a regular basis as well as comforters, blankets, throw blankets, pillows, and sheet sets. When you travel and stay in a hotel or motel, please save the complimentary toiletries (soap, shampoo, conditioner, hand cream, and tooth paste) that are provided. These items are greatly needed and appreciated by the women that stay at *Nancy's Place*.

Lay the foundation first!

Dear Dave,

We've read about your plan, and we're in pretty good shape financially, but we don't know what to do next. We have \$400,000 in a 401(k) for retirement, but we don't have an emergency fund or any other savings. The only debt we have is our house. What should we do about Baby Steps 4 and 6?

Mary

Dear Mary,

You guys have done a great job of saving for retirement and staying out of debt. Let's go over the Baby Steps you mentioned. Baby Step 4 is putting 15 percent of your income into Roth IRAs and pre-tax retirement plans. Baby Step 6 is paying off your home early.

The thing that worries me is you've completely skipped Baby Step 3, which is having three to six months of expenses in an emergency fund. This is money set aside strictly for emergencies, not vacations, toys or a new car. The problem right now is if you have a real emergency, you'll have to cash out your 401(k). If you do that, the government's going to penalize you 10 percent, plus your tax rate. That's about a 40-percent kick in the teeth just because you didn't do things in the right order!

Again, you're in pretty good shape overall, but in building your financial house you've put the roof on before you've laid the foundation. If I'm you, I'm going to temporarily stop my 401(k) contributions until I get my emergency fund fully loaded. By temporarily, I mean six months at most. That way, you'll be covered when life happens without having to sacrifice your retirement savings!
