

The Daily Texts

From the leaders who disciplined me when I was a teenager, I learned the importance of daily being in God's Word and in prayer. I also realized early that this would be a struggle for me. I am not a person of habits. As an extrovert, I gain my strength through being with people more than being alone. I get bored easily with routines. You can see why it has been a challenge for me to maintain a daily quiet time with the Lord. I have started and stopped various forms of a daily quiet time many, many times. Over the years, when I have asked the Lord what He would like to change in me, by far the most common answer the Lord has given me is to more consistently spend time with Him in prayer and reflection on Scripture. Through *God's grace in structure*, I have grown to where this is now a fairly consistent practice for me.

I have learned that it is important for me to have a structure to help me maintain the discipline of a daily quiet time with the Lord. I will not remain consistent if there is no structure to my daily quiet time. This is why I am thrilled to lead you into following the *Daily Texts* in 2012. A "text" is a short reading of a few verses from the Bible. First published in 1731 in Saxony (now in Germany), the *Daily Texts* grew out of a spiritual renewal in the Moravian Church. In 1722, Count Nicholas Ludwig von Zinzendorf offered his property to provide shelter for religious refugees. This settlement became known as Herrnhut, meaning "under the watch of the Lord." Each evening Zinzendorf offered a *losung*, or "watchword," for the next day that was intended to shape the conversations among the members of the Moravian congregation at Herrnhut. A person in the congregation went daily to each of the thirty-two houses in Herrnhut to bring them the watchword for the next day. From this practice, there was compiled a list of about 2000 watchwords (verses) from the Old Testament. Each verse is either a promise, an encouragement, or an admonition. Later verses from the New Testament were added to illuminate the daily watchword. I am reminded that the Lord once said to the prophet Ezekiel "You are the one I have made a watchman for Israel. If you hear a word from my mouth, you must warn them for me." Ezekiel 33:7

The *Daily Texts* will give you a helpful and easily-followed structure to guide your daily prayer and meditation on God's Word. This practice is modeled after the devotional life of Martin Luther. Luther's Small Catechism is included in the *Daily Texts*, as well as other instruction in how Luther prayed and reflected on Scripture. There is a range of engagement available in the *Daily Texts* that allows you to spend as little as one minute in reading and praying, or you can go as far as following the guide to read through the entire Bible. The *Daily Texts* also offers you a structure for your prayer time that allows you to take a T.R.I.P. with God each day using these questions: **Thanks:** *What in this verse makes me thankful?* **Regret** (confession): *What in this verse causes me regret?* **Intercession** (ask): *What does this text lead me to pray for?* **Plan of action:** *What action does this text encourage me to take today?* By reading the daily texts and praying your T.R.I.P. prayers, the Holy Spirit will lead you into daily meditation on God's Word and walking in the light of the freedom we have in Christ.



My son, Sam, offered a younger generation perspective on the *Daily Texts* that made me laugh when we were opening gifts on Christmas Day. When I talked about the *Daily Texts* in worship, Sam said that he first thought of God *texting* us like we do with our cell phones. Sam thought how God is so far out ahead of us in that, hundreds of years before cell phones, God began texting His people. This is true! In 2012, you are invited to join me and the other members of the St. Luke family in following God's daily texts to guide our time with Lord each day. How awesome it will be to meditate on the same Bible verses together each day! The *Daily Texts* are now available at the Welcome Place for a cost of five dollars.

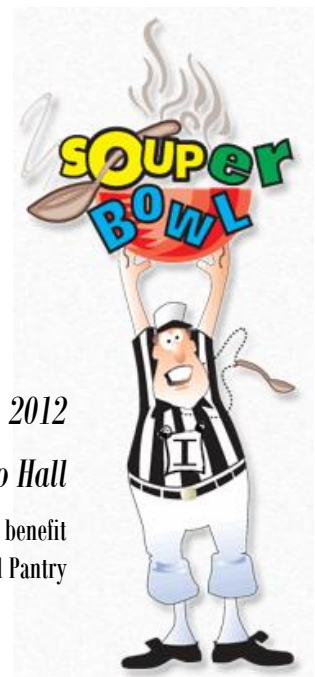

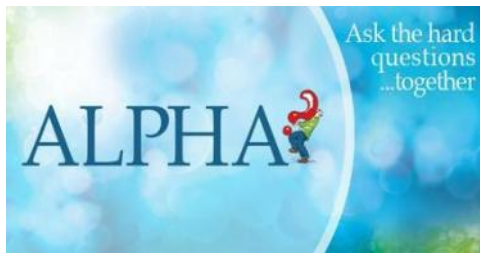
New Sunday Morning Life Group for Adult

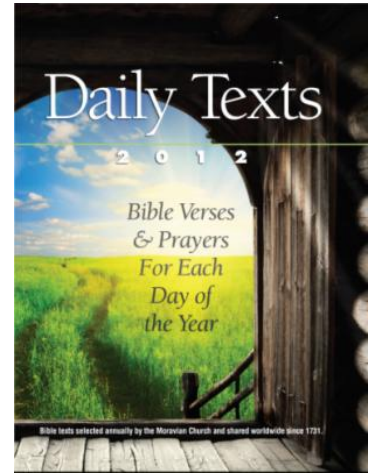

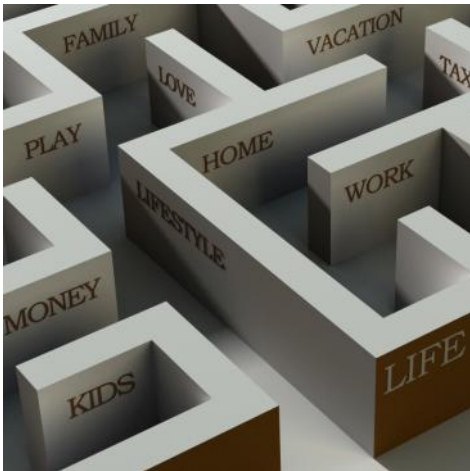

Council Highlights

Dear St. Luke Family,

Happy New Year! I've been thinking a lot about the Discipleship Path (Learn – Live – Unleash) and the changes that are being made at St. Luke to encourage all of us to take the next steps along that path. As I was reflecting on that vision, my grandfather came to my mind. He was a man who understood the Discipleship Path and lived his life accordingly. He was a life-long member of the Lutheran church, learning on a weekly basis in worship and sometimes filling in as a lay preacher. He lived out his faith with Christian friends in Bible study, sometimes as a participant but often as the leader. He unleashed God's love by serving within his church but also in his community as a member of the school board, Kiwanis Club, and as a 4H leader (among other things). Throughout his 87-year life, he never lost faith or his desire to study God's Word.

When Paul and I were expecting our first son, Stephen, we decided he would share a middle name, Dale, with his great-grandfather. My grandfather and his first great-grandchild did not have much time to develop a relationship, but my grandfather wrote Stephen a note for me to put among his other keepsakes. Of all the things he could have written about, my grandfather chose to share about Jesus. He wrote, "I can remember sitting at my mother's and grandmother's feet when they taught me about Jesus. It will not be long until your mother and grandmother do the same for you. Then you will go to Sunday School and learn more. I hope your folks will take – not just send- you. Then after awhile you will study catechism where you will still learn more including the 10 Commandments." He went on to tell my son that he will find God's promise in the Bible and that he should learn it soon and carry it always in his heart and mind.

I share this story because my grandfather's life is a powerful example of how we mature as Disciples of Christ and how we share that with others to help them grow in their faith. Whether taking our children to Sunday school, inviting friends to church or into a Life Group, or sharing the love of Jesus when serving others, disciplining others is another step we can each take on the discipleship path. Thank you, grandpa, for teaching us this lesson across time and the generations.
