### The Necessity of Lifelong Biblical Instruction

*It is written: "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has prepared for those who love him" – but God has revealed it to us by his Spirit. The Spirit searches all things, even the deep things of God. For who among men knows the thoughts of a man except the man's spirit within him? In the same way no one knows the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God. We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit who is from God, that we may understand what God has freely given us. This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, expressing spiritual truths in spiritual words. The man without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually discerned. The spiritual man makes judgments about all things, but he himself is not subject to any man's judgment: "For who has known the mind of the Lord that he may instruct him?" **But we have the mind of Christ.** 1 Corinthians 2:9-16*

**I think that my parents would say** that I was rebellious when I was in junior high. I gave my parents fits during those years. This was also the time of catechism in my church. I fought with my parents over attending Saturday morning catechism and completing the homework. I wanted to drop out. I caused trouble in class. My parents and my pastor patiently dragged me through the two years of catechism, often having to use bribe or punishment. When I was done with catechism, I wanted very little to do with instruction in the Christian faith ever again. After my confirmation in the spring of my 8<sup>th</sup> grade year, my parents gave me the choice of whether to attend worship, Sunday School, or youth group. My plan was to attend worship but nothing else. I viewed my confirmation as graduation from Christian instruction. I thought that I had learned everything I needed to know about God's love for me. How foolish I was to think this. I thank God for the events that led me back into experiencing God's love through living life with other Christians and being instructed in the faith. In the youth group of my church, I continued to grow towards spiritual maturity. Without the experiences of living God's love in this life group, I am certain that I would have slowly drifted away from the faith.

**There is a necessity for lifelong instruction** in the Christian faith. In this life we do not ever arrive at the point where we have completed the spiritual instruction that God has for us. We continue to grow into spiritual maturing throughout our whole lives. There will always be more that the Lord has to teach us. This happens best when we are living life with a group of Christ followers and regularly learning together from God's Word. If we think that we no longer need instruction in the Christian faith, we are great fools.

**The Christians in Corinth** thought they had learned all they needed to know. They had, after all, been initially instructed by excellent teachers like Paul and Apollos. There was, however, more spiritual truth they needed to learn. Therefore, Paul wrote the Corinthians letters to continue instructing them in spiritual truths. In the month of September, we will read and teach through Paul's letters to the Corinthians.

**My dear ones, as Paul taught the Corinthians,** let us be reminded that there are "*deep things of God*" that we must continue to learn and grow to understand. They must be taught to us by the Holy Spirit so that we can spiritually discern these spiritual truths. To do this, it is best for us to regularly put ourselves in a place where we are taught by the Holy Spirit speaking through other believers. I hope that you are planning to be in a group of believers that will regularly learn and discuss the Bible – God's Word for us. At St. Luke you can experience this in Sunday School, small group, or men's and women's Bible Study. I hope you will bring your children to Sunday School and catechism. As we move toward 2012, you will be presented with more opportunities to learn the "deep things of God." Let us move towards having the mind of Christ through lifelong Biblical instruction!

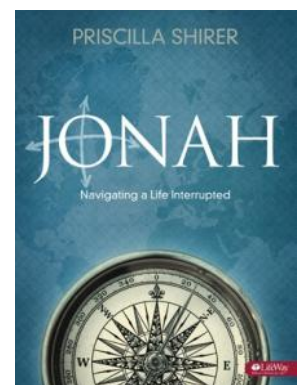
