1 Kings 8:22-30, 41-43 Colossians 1:15-20 John 14:1-3, 16:33

- 1. Why do we need God to dwell with us?
- 2. Why has there long been this question, "Will God really dwell with us?"

- At the dedication of the temple in Jerusalem, King Solomon prayed to God, "Will God really dwell on earth? The heavens, even the highest heaven, cannot contain you. How much less this temple I have built."

 1 Kings 8:27
- At his trial before the Sanhedrin, the first Christian martyr, Stephen said, "It was Solomon who built a house for God. However, the Most High does not live in houses made by human hands." Acts 7:47-48
- 3. At the Last Supper Jesus said to his troubled disciples, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me."

"My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you?

"And when I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." John 14:1-3

- The disciples still do get it. What does Philip want?
- Jesus answered Philip's request, "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Don't you believe that I am in the Father, and that the Father is in me?
